As a Girls First Champion, we attended the conference in Ottawa in April 2018 to learn about Girls First and to get some insight on how to present the sessions. The first provincial session was given at end of June/early July to get it started. The sessions came fast and hard at first. A lot of Guiders were ready to take it in early September. Province then hosted a Girls First Launch Party at Lion Max Simms which coincided with the National Launch of Girls First and many of the Girls First Champions attend and supported a successful event. Sessions were done through Adobe Connect as well as Face to Face Sessions throughout the province in addition to the Provincial Centennial Celebrations Conference sessions with other Guiders in the province.

#### Con Ba Su Area - Commissioner, Georgina Laine
