Planning for your Campfire

We would love this campfire to shine the light on the unique and amazing group of youth in your unit. Campfires are even better if you get a few units together and share the joy of music at a bridging event with others. This challenge can be run in one meeting or over a few meetings.

- Are you bridging with another unit? Make a plan and send them an invitation. Maybe they can come with a song about their unit too.
- Pick your place. Are you singing in your meeting place, or outdoors around a real campfire? Your activities might change depending on the venue.
- Pick your special activities or create your own. For ideas from the Program platform, see the Activities section:

Here are some of our suggestions:

- Make instruments to use in your campfire using recyclable supplies or something from nature. Don't forget to plan which songs you want to use the instruments in.
- Pick a favorite camp song and write new words that tells a story about your unit.
 We have heard versions everywhere from stories about a canoe trip to songs
 about rutabagas and everything silly and fun in between. How about a song about
 that random butternut squash you found during a forest hike? (Yup, it really
 happened).
- Check out the Recycle the Song activity that creates a whole new version of Little Green Frog. What song could your group recycle?
- Can you sing one of the songs in a different style... how about like an animated musical or rap or K-pop style. Karaoke anyone?
- Select your songs from the Song List.
 - Not every song in your campfire needs to have new words or creative versions. A
 blended version of traditional songs and creative versions is a perfect mix of
 making it fun without too much work.
 - Decide the order you want to sing them in and plan who will lead each song.
 - Figure out where the activities or unit's own versions fit in the meeting.
- After your campfire, consider sharing your fun.
