## Message from the PC

You may be surprised to learn that every Provincial Council in Canada currently functions with a different structure to manage its administrative and management tasks. This was one of many factors that was observed and examined in a recent review of GGC's policies, bylaws and structures.

In June of 2015, the National Board considered and voted on a wide range of recommendations, based on studies conducted for over a year prior to this review, and it will be implementing these recommendations, some over this year, others over the next two to three years.

For the most part they impact finer definitions of governance and won't really be felt in member action. One recommendation that will be of greater impact, and we hope great benefit to the organization, is the re-structuring of Provincial Councils to a common template, the same model right across the county! The Provincial Commissioners, myself included, have worked on this task for almost a year now. Its final course, in September, involved all Council members, Advisers and District Commissioners in Québec!

At Symposium on the 16<sup>th</sup>, the new structure will be shared, so attendees get a first glimpse at this structure, and importantly, how our existing model will "morph" into this new framework. Check back to **this link** next week, as it will connect to a presentation of the changes.

This will mean new Council positions will be created, some changed in scope, and others will be eliminated. This will also mean that members will be asked to get involved in the management of our province by submitting their candidacy for these new or revised positions.

Terms of reference should be available by our next Piccolo edition, and we hope many of you will seriously consider taking a role in Council. It represents 5 or 6 meetings a year, and really is one of the lighter "hats" in Guiding, but it is vitally important to the healthy management and future action planning for Québec.

## Wa-Thik-Ane Reservations

The rental procedures for <u>Camp Wa-Thik-Ane</u> have changed to optimize the reservation process with a positive revenue stream for our Provincial Camp! If you haven't already consulted with parents for best weekends to get their commitment, it's a good idea to do it now. Don't wait!

#### The first weekend available for reservation is May 14, 2016

First reservations of the season

- Reservation forms for 2016 started on January 4, 2016. Only reservations received with a 25% deposit will be considered now and throughout the year. <u>Camp Wa-Thik-Ane Reservation Form</u>. All reservation forms must have 1st, 2nd and 3rd choices indicated. <u>Something New!</u>
- Site minimum charges are now in place = 75% of the site capacity charge for nights booked.
- There is also a new space on the reservation form for site sharing. (when you do not have enough people to fit the site capacity)
- With Exception For the first reservations of the 2016, all forms and deposits received by January 15, 2016 will be logged.

The reservations will be placed in order of receipt and all Responsible Guiders will be contacted in the following week (Jan 18-Jan 22) to acknowledge receipt of the reservation request and be advised if there is any conflict or contention with the reservation request.

Please remember we are trying to not to repeat the cancellation deluge of the 2015 reservations.

Please note the following changes: Camp Wa-Thik-Ane Rental Rates

- The classification of dates has been changed no more 'In or Out' of season.
- The rental rates have increased and are the same for the rental season weekends May through September.

There will be site minimum charges imposed. (ex: Huron has a capacity of 40 people. If you are booking for 20 people and if this is what you really want, you will have to pay for 75% of the 40 person capacity. Not just for 20 people.

• In these types of cases we are offering a site sharing option when and where applicable.


#### A Cookie Pin Just for Rangers!



#### Out with the old year:

January; a time of quiet recovery after the hectic holidays. The children are back at school, snowflakes drift softly down, and you've got peace and quiet to get your Guiding finances in order before the end of



the month! But of course that will only take an hour or two at most if you've kept up to date all year, as I am sure many of you have!

Please make sure you include all supporting documents with your financial books when you give them to your

District Treasurer (Units and Trefoil Guilds) or the Provincial Office (Districts) for review. This is the biggest cause for delays in getting the books back to you, especially as we review the District books.



The deadline for submitting your books for review is January 31. This applies to both Unit and District books.

Remember that you must use independent reviewers (no signing offi-

cers, relations or business connections) for the Unit books. Usually this can be done at a book review party of all the Unit Treasurers in the District.

Be sure to use the new <u>Financial Review Checklist</u> with questions about taxes on the GGC Quebec website under <u>Quebec Forms</u>, with the GGC-QC Financial Package.

This year, we will have the District Treasurers review each other's books in a similar format as we have in past. We will meet at the same time as the DCs in February, so you can carpool. Those who attend will be able to take their books home with them. Hope to see you all then!
