

Girl Guides opening micro-library in Pincourt

A service project started by local Guide unit will become a free community book exchange.

Pincourt, Québec, 21 May, 2015- The 1st Pincourt Guide Unit is launching Word to Word, a micro-library project started with architectural designer Kanchan Quinlan, which offers a free community book exchange in their community. The launch event on June 6th is the official introduction of the micro-library to the area and is open to all. The micro-library will be a place where members of the community can take and leave books for free, operating on the honour system. The micro-library has been several months in the making after planning between the Guides and Ms. Quinlan, which included proposing the project to the town of Pincourt. The project is sponsored by Maple Harbour Bedding.

It is the 1st Pincourt Guide Unit's contribution to the GGC National Service Project (NSP) *Words in Action – Des mots en action*. The NSP addresses the UN Millennium Development Goal – Achieve Universal Primary Education, promoting the importance of literacy and increasing access to books across Canada. To date, 7068 girl members have participated in the project and 32540 books have been donated to the project, the actions are tracked at nsp.girlguides.ca
