



# Treasurers' Trove



## **Signing Officers:**

If you haven't updated them yet, please do so now. This must be done for all unit and district accounts every year. This must show in District minutes, although if there are no changes, you should not have to visit the bank. Don't forget that Pamela and Sue must be on all District level accounts.

## **Budget for Districts:**

Please include it with your next District Minutes. It is a good idea for units to do a budget too, but not required.



## **Year-end:**

Year-end is Dec 31, which is coming soon, so make sure your books are up to date before the Holiday rush! That will make it easier to wind things up for Dec 31, when they must be closed for review.



## **Financial Reviews:**

Unit books should be reviewed within the district, as long as those doing the review meet the requirements for independent reviewers in the Handbooks. District Treasurers should send the Annual Financial Reports and copies of the Financial Review Checklists to the Provincial Office.

**District books** will be reviewed by the District Treasurers at a Book Review evening this year. Please send all documentation (see list in Treasurer Handbooks) to the office by **Jan 31, 2012**. We will let you know when we will meet.



**Trefoil Guilds:** The financial books of Trefoil Guilds with their own bank accounts should also be reviewed at year-end. They should be treated as Unit books and reviewed within the District.

## CAMP WA-THIK-ANE – 2012 RENTAL RATES

**Out of Season:** From the opening of camp (weather dependant, but is usually the 2<sup>nd</sup> weekend in May) to June 1<sup>st</sup>, as well as September and October until the close of camp (prior to Thanksgiving). During the “Out of Season” period there will be no swimming or boating. Whenever possible, there will be a Guider in Charge present.

# SAFE GUIDE NEWS



The Safe guide is our risk management program and Guiders must take the face to face or e-learning training before they can become the responsible Guide for an activity or event. Safe Guide training is mandatory and must be completed within a new Guider's first six months as a member. For the new Guiders of September 2011, March is your deadline. For the Guiders registered before, September 2011, you had a year from your registration date to comply with the requirements.

Talk to your DC and perhaps we can provide a Safe Guide training in your district at your convenience.

## REMINDERS

- By now, all experienced Guiders should have read all the changes in Safe Guide as of July 2011 found on the GGC National website.
- Qualifications: any Guiders with qualifications (First Aid, National Lifeguard, paddling, etc) should have their qualifications registered in iMIS.
- Health Care Professionals must have a current CPR, and should have their professional qualifications registered in iMIS.
- Non-member volunteers acting as **Home Contact Person** for units should be registered in iMIS. Please use the A.7 form.
- SG.3 (notification/authorization) must be sent to the Assessor for yellow/red level activity or event. An assessor may require more information from you and request that you send her your SG.1, SG.2 and /or the SG.4.
- If you are using a **Third Party Service Provider**, please follow the TPSP Guidelines found on page 69 of Safe Guide. Please remember that the submission of a completed SG.7 to your assessor **MAY** be necessary - depending on the TPSP activity.
- Your SG.4 (emergency response plan) **MUST be adapted** to your activity. Also refer to the Appendix H in Safe Guide.
- Rangers cannot submit Safe Guide forms **directly** for assessment. Rangers can, however, complete the Safe Guide forms and submit them to their Guider for review. The Ranger Guider will review the forms, make any changes necessary and submit them for assessment. Only a fully screened Guider who has completed the Safe Guide training module can assume the overall responsibility for an activity.
- Planning is a **MUST** before you start filling out any forms. **Using the SG Activity Guide with the closest fit to your event is a great first step in helping plan the content, preparation and safety management of your activity.** The completion of forms is really the documentation stage of the planning process and is the last step in that process.
- Make sure that your forms get to the Assessor at [safeguide@guidesquebec.ca](mailto:safeguide@guidesquebec.ca) on time; at least two weeks before your event, to allow for any follow up that might be needed. Safe Guide Assessors are volunteers just like you and wear many hats both in Guiding and in their "other" lives.

# Cookie News!




A huge **Congratulations** to everyone who sold and helped to support the selling of the Mint cookies this fall.

**It was a success!**

There were even requests for 100 extra cases throughout the province!

Girl Guides in Québec sold **3617** cases of mint cookies!!!!

This is an increase over the number of members at that time in the province. Once again congratulations!



Spring Classic cookie orders are coming up - your District Commissioner will receive an email with the order form in December.

Do not forget to think about the success we had with the Mint Campaign when you pass on your numbers. Our goal as a province is 4000 cases which = 2 cases per girl + fundraising cases.

## Cookie Price Increase FAQ's from the National Website

### Q. What will the new price of cookies be?

A. Cookies will retail for \$5.00 per box, beginning with the Classic 2012 campaign. This equals a \$12 increase per case.

### Q. Why are we increasing the price?

A. We are increasing the price due to rising costs of ingredients, manufacturing and distribution, as well as the rising costs associated with delivering quality Girl Guide programming.

### Q. How will the \$12 increase per case be distributed?

- \$3.00 to address rising cookie costs and ensure a 6-year cost stability (at 3% annual growth)
- \$4.75 to National budget to fund operational initiatives, including programming, events and international travel.
- \$0.75 to provincial Member subsidies to ensure all Canadian girls have the opportunity to experience Guiding (collected and managed at the provincial level)
- \$1.00 to the Guaranteed Unit Share (collected at provincial level)
- \$2.50 to the Provinces (collected and managed at provincial level)

### Q. When was the last time we had a price increase to the consumer?

A. The last time we increased the price was in 2003.

### Q. How long will this new price remain in effect?

A. Barring any unforeseen circumstances we expect to be able to hold the retail price of the cookies at \$5.00/box for approximately six years.

### Q. How do we know that consumers will pay \$5.00/box for cookies?

A. In the fall of 2010 we commissioned a survey of over 1000 consumers. The results indicated that over 80% of Canadians would pay \$5.00/box for a box of cookies. In fact only 4.3% of people who *did not* buy Girl Guides cookies said they were too expensive.

### Q. Why are we changing the price in the middle of the Guiding season?

A. The timing was chosen to reflect our fiscal year (calendar). This allows all levels of Guiding to better prepare their annual budgets.

**N.B. All First Aid Qualifications must be entered into iMIS before your Safe Guide Activity!**

**Please also be aware that any Health Care Professional must have a current CPR certification, and both the CPR and the professional qualifications must be entered into iMIS**

All Pulse Aide Inc. Courses now include the NEWLY RELEASED First Aid and CPR/AED Revised Program Standards for 2012, and the NEW Red Cross Manual. Certification is valid for 3 years from the date of the certification.

**Emergency First Aid Course** (8 hours) – Sat. February 4, 2012 8:30am-5:30pm NDG \$95

**Standard First Aid Course** (16 hours) – Sat. & Sun. February 4 & 5, 2012 8:30am-5:30pm NDG \$115

We went camping many places, including in the wet West Coast Rainforest; we cycle-toured various local islands; we planned activities, workshops, and entire camps for younger branches of Guiding; and we learned to batik, knit, and even fix a broken toilet!

Thus, Link can be **whatever** you want it to be and **however much** you want it to be. Link members can be part of a group, or just on their own. Interested??
