ing our best. The words that follow may change, reflect a newer vision, a broader more inclusive ideal, and goals that inspire, defined by the times. Really though – we are together, then as now, giving the best of ourselves every time we make our Promise – for the girls and for each other.

GGC-Québec Council offers one scholarship of \$1,000 for a complete year of post-secondary education. This yearly scholarship is awarded to a versatile individual who is a registered Québec Member of Girl Guides of Canada-Guides du Canada. Its objective is to encourage further education/training at a recognized post-secondary Québec institution such as CEGEP, technical/vocational school or university.

Who can apply? Any registered Québec Member of Girl Guides of Canada-Guides du Canada who is entering or pursuing post-secondary education (in any field of study) on a full-time basis. Former Guiders are not eligible to apply. This scholarship is based on your active Guiding and community involvement.

Fundraising Changes

While the approval process has not changed, reporting has. All groups wishing to do a fundraiser for any reason must now fill out the FR.1 from the GGC national <u>Forms</u> page.

Reminder: All fundraising for trips and district activities must be approved by your friendly neighbourhood Québec Council rep (me!). Unit fundraisers for unit activities may be approved by the district council.

In any case, please forward a copy of the FR.1 to me so that I can keep a list of all fundraisers done in the province, as required by the national office.

Mid-Year Reviews

The Guiding year is winding to a close, and while most of you will have a break from doing Guiding books over the summer, there is one job left before you can relax! The time for the mid-year report has come.

All treasurers should balance their books at this time in preparation for the fall. Your mid-year report will cover the period from January 1, 2014 to the spring 'end' of the Guiding year, the exact date of which will vary depending on your unit or council, usually in May or June. Doing this now will help you to close your books at the end of December, as everything should balance and make sense for the first half of the year, and it will be done while you still remember what happened!

Units and Trefoil Guilds:

Financial books should be collected by the District Treasurers who should check that everything balances, is reasonable and clearly explained.

District Treasurers:

I will be reviewing all district books this time. I want to make sure that everyone is reporting the GST/QST properly. Please print and send a copy of the Monthly Report to date (i.e. January 1, 2014 to the end of the season), along with all receipts, invoices, bank statements, etc. Please include some explanation of major variations from your budget, given that the budget is for the full year.

It would be greatly appreciated if reports were received at the provincial office as soon as possible after the end of your season, preferably by the end of June.

Once you have had your books reviewed, simply carry on from where you left off. Remember that you will have to submit your books, including all receipts, etc., for the *entire* year when you submit your books for the Annual Financial Review in January.

For **units and districts** where the treasurer is changing over the summer, a full independent review must be done now.

Safe Guide: our risk management program! Safety is the responsibility of all!

April and May are months where many Guiders are due to complete their **Safe Guide training.** Remember, it is <u>compulsory</u> for new Guiders to complete the training within the first six months of becoming a leader.

For a face-to-face training: Contact your DC to discuss the possibility of a training in your district and give her your availability.

Online training: for Guiders who cannot attend a face-to-face training. Contact the provincial office (admin@guidesquebec.ca) for instructions and a PIN.



It's nearly time for swimming!

Refer to the **Swimming** section of Safe Guide. The swimming planning chart on page 80 will tell you the level of your activity. Check your general supervision ratio for swimming on pages 83 and 84.

For a yellow level activity, make sure your **W.1** is with your **SG.3** when you submit it to **sg.gs@guidesquebec.ca** for assessment. Be sure to send your form in on time (at least two weeks ahead of your activity) so we can make sure your activity is safe and goes ahead as planned. (The assessment of water activities is sent to a specific Water Assessor.) If in doubt, consult the **full Safe Guide document** or ask: sg.gs@guidesquebec.ca
