What:Experience Carnaval in Québec City with other Pathfinder UnitsIndividual groups will experience Carnaval as they wish during the day Saturday and
Saturday evening. Visit the Carnaval web site for information on what is offered.

- When: Friday, February 5, approx. 6:00 p.m. to Sunday, February approx. 7:30 p.m. Bus stops will be determined after groups have registered (likely West Island, West Mon tréal, South Shore). Group accommodation will be Holy Trinity Cathedral, downtown Québec City.
- Who: Open to all Pathfinders in Québec. Guiders must accompany their girls.
- **Cost:** \$175.00 which includes transportation (coach bus), sleeping accommodation, meals and snacks, Carnaval "effigy" (admission to Carnaval activities), visit to the Ice Hotel, *Cabane à Sucre* supper on the way home and all taxes.
- **Forms:** SG.1 and SG.2 are available (in English and French) on the <u>forms page</u> of the Québec website, Guiders must complete the unit registration form to register their girls.

The maximum number of participants is 48 and will be on a first-come-first-served basis. There is a possibility of including Rangers, but priority will be given to Pathfinders.

Changes to Wa-Thik-Ane Rates and process

The Wa-Thik-Ane Property Committee has been looking at the rates for site and Stavert rentals, as well as the reservation process. This arose from problems that became apparent this past winter and spring. The "first-in-first-choice" system had some issues. We also had some serious loss of revenues due to sites being reserved and then either released later in the spring or far fewer campers than anticipated.

We are endeavoring to make the process more fair and to increase the number of campers, especially on popular weekends.

If you are considering a camp in the spring, you may want to poll your girls before the holidays to ascertain level of interest – "probably will or probably won't" will give you more solid numbers when you are choosing your sites.

Red Cross First Aid Courses from Pulse Aide Inc.

Tailored to the needs of GGC as per Safe Guide July 2015



Complete details of First Aid Requirements for Safe Guide Activity Levels are found in the Safe Guide document, July 2015 update, found on the Girl Guides of Canada national website. Please note that online e-learning courses are not acceptable. Also, in Quebec, Blended Learning courses (online courses with an in-person hands-on learning component) are not available from the Red Cross as there is no French counterpart to their national program.

Pages of interest in Safe Guide 2015 relating to First Aid include, but are not limited to, pages 9 - 13 and 29 - 33.

N.B. All First Aid Qualifications must be entered into iMIS before your Safe Guide Activity!

Recertification Courses for Emergency and Standard First Aid (8 hours) – 2 dates and locations scheduled Pre-requisite: All Participants must have a current (not expired) Red Cross Certification at the time of the course, must bring their own First Aid & CPR Manual, 2011 edition, to the course, and must review all material before the course.

8 hours – 3 year cert 1. Sunday November 29, 2015 **\$85 with Own manual** 2. Saturday January 9, 2016

Kirkland Laval

Full Emergency or Standard First Aid Course required if you have no certification or one that has already expired.

Upon completion, GGC–Quebec Council will reimburse 2/3 of the course cost for active Guiders
