
Guiding Starts with You!

2016 Quebec Provincial Fall Fun Day

Saturday, October 1

A wonderful day at Wa-Thik-Ane

What: A fun packed day at our provincial camp in Morin Heights with games, outdoor cooking, camp skills

and camp songs all while celebrating our 90th year of camping at Wa-Thik-Ane.

The goal of this event is to encourage new and experienced campers and Guiders to visit the camp and try camping without the concern of the overnight or the required planning and to give those who

love camping another chance to enjoy it before the winter.

When: Saturday, October 1, 2016

9:30 am—arrival at Wa-Thik-Ane, Morin Heights

7:30 pm—departure from Wa-Thik-Ane, Morin-Heights

Transportation: Departure approx. 8 am, from location on the registration form; return approx. 9 pm to same location

One Guider per full patrol (based on branch-specific ratio) travels free

Who: Guiders of all branches and their girls

Each Guider may bring a full patrol (based on branch specific ratio)

Mixed groups must meet youngest girl ratio

A PRC-checked adult female may accompany girls in place of a Guider, but will be expected to

participate as a facilitator of the day's program

Cost: \$45.00 per person (girls and adults)

Includes 3 snacks, 2 meals, a crest and activities

Includes transportation -see discount on registration form

French) are available on the Forms page of the Québec website.

The International Day of Peace is coming up on September 21. See National's <u>Instant</u> <u>Meeting</u> for some ideas about how to cover the topic with your girls!


International Day of the Girl

Time: New Guider Training (including Safe Guide) 11:30 AM – 3:30 PM / Changing Branches 8:45 am - 12 am.



Safe Guide: our risk management program! Safety is the responsibility of all!

The **2016** version of **Safe Guide** is now available on the national Safe Guide <u>web page</u> along with an explanation of changes (6 pages). **All Guiders** should read this document carefully. It will give you the highlights of the different changes with detailed explanations as you will need to refer to the **2016** version of Safe Guide when planning activities. **All previous versions** are out of date.

What's new? Here are a few highlights: Please download the Explanations of Changes.

- First Aid training: edited to clarify who can be a first aider and for consistency in wording. P 33.
- **Health care professionals** When a health care professional with a qualification not listed in the definition has relevant expertise, Guiders should contact safeguide@girlguides.ca. **P.11.**
- General Planning for Activities, Please read:
 - Pre-planning and Activity Levels P 15.
 - Parent/Guardian Notification and Permission: Yellow and Red Levels activities. P 18
 - Supervision Ratios: P 24
 - Role of Supervisors P27.
- Incident report: (INS.01) Incident reports should only be sent by the reporting Guider to the national and provincial office.
 They are not share with anyone else. P 37.
- Appendices: There are changes in Appendix A, B, D, E, I, L. from page 156 to 175
- International Travel 72 Hours or More: planning guide please see the section Making your trip happen: What you need to know and do. From the page 129 to 151

Changes in the forms: SG.2, SG.3, SG.4, SG.8, and IT.1, IT.3, IT.4.

REMINDERS:

- As of September 2016 all activities must be planned based on the July 2016 version of Safe Guide.
- It is important that Guiders develop their **Emergency Response Plan** (ERP) **related to their activity** and make sure that **ALL** the Guiders in the unit have read it for each specific activity.
- Safe Guide training is required of all new members within six months of joining Girl Guides.
- Now is a good time to locate your First Aid certification card and check on the expiry date. You may be due to renew your qualifications
- All Safe Guide forms should be sent to sg.gs@guidesquebec.ca for assessment 14 days in advance.

This year out of respect for the ASSESSORS we will work all together to send our forms on time.
