TREFOIL TRAILS REMINDERS:



Groups may book a single site or any combination of sites:

- Lodge residential (sleeping in building; dining in building or on deck)
- Pixie Glen semi-residential (sleeping in three eight-bunk cottages; dining in building or on deck)
- **Nyeri** tenting (provide own tents or rent from Area; cook outdoors equipped dining shelter provided)
- Pathways tenting (provide own tents or rent from Area/cook outdoors basic dining shelter provided)

FREE MEETING PASS PROGRAM



GIRL DRIVEN AMBASSADORS

Yvonne Harrison and Laurie Lanovaz were selected by the National Training team as two of the 14 Girl-Driven Ambassadors across Canada for Girl Guides of Canada. Our role is to support Guiders in Girl-Driven Programming for their units. Letting the girls take the lead, whether they be Sparks or a Rangers, is not just allowing them to take the keys and drive the car. They need guidance, practice, mentoring and skill building. Learn more about the five Pillars that create the foundation of support that the girls need to take the lead in your unit and unit meetings. Find out how to structure your meetings for girls to have choice, use their voice and take action.

Our first two sessions on Girl-Driven Programming will be held at the January Conference in Regina. One will be geared towards new Guiders and the second for experienced Guiders. Service Projects at Christmas


There are so many ways for your units to give back to the community throughout the year, but I think Christmastime is the most fun.
