These modules are: Safe Guide, Building Unit Guider Skills, The Girl Program, All About Your Branch (branch specific) and Safe and Inclusive Spaces (separate from the Diversity & Inclusive modules 1 through 4). Also, please note that there have been some technical glitches with the online Safe Guide module. If you have been having trouble, please contact either myself or the Provincial Office. National is aware of the glitches and promises that no Guider will be "kicked out of her unit" due to not completing Safe Guide within the correct time period if you have been having issues with the online module. However, you do need to contact us if this has happened to you so that we can make other arrangements for you. National expects that this issue will be cleared up soon, but in the meantime remember to check with us if you have problems with the online module kicking you out.


