October and November are busy months for Guiders and girls as units get into full swing. My own unit just had its enrolment with 20 new girls. Exciting and exhilarating and crazy! But our group is coming together nicely. On top of this, our unit is trying to do a combo of the old program and new program. Again – exciting, exhilarating and crazy! BUT... all worth it!

Over the past few weeks, we have generated some great service project ideas with the girls and completed a large dot survey of ideas for the year. We found out important things about the girls through this activity. We found out that they want to do crafts – not just easy to do crafts – but more intensive crafts like rock painting, knitting tubes and Sharpie and Alcohol creations on tiles. (May have helped that I showed examples of my craftiness!) We also were pleasantly surprised to find out the girls think snow shovelling for seniors and neighbours is "way cool"! And they were excited to take in some of the community programs such as cooking classes at Sobey's, Wet Paint Pottery and attend a play at the local high school.

We even had one girl so excited about the possibility of doing a Tipi Sleepover, that she convinced the entire unit that it would the best event of the year and promised to share with us everything about Wanuskewin when we go there. That excitement spilled over to the entire group as the number of "dots" exceeded almost every other choice (except the snow shovelling!) All in all, by the time I popped their top ideas into the meeting plans, there are very few meetings to fill and it all fits together under both the old and new program. It's a WIN! And we are all pumped for the year.

I understand the anxiousness. I know how important our time is and understand the concerns with the extra effort needed to commit to start into a new program. I know it will be all worth it. I think we will have more girls engaged in the program, more enthusiastic Guiders, and overall, GGC will be stronger!

The year is off to a great start with many Units\Districts planning activities! Way to go!

Safe Guide Assessors are needed to help units\groups ensure that these activities can go ahead. Without enough Assessors there may be a possibility your activity will not be approved within the time frame you are accustomed. More Assessors means many more opportunities can be provided to the girls in the province. Please contact the Provincial Office if you are interested in becoming a Safe Guide Assessor.

Who is a supervisor:

To be counted as a supervisor you must be a fully screened member; for non-members an A7 form is also required. Members over the age of 16 can be counted as a supervisor for Green level (there must still be two adult supervisors) and over 18 for Yellow and Red level activities.

Not sure or have questions related to an activity you want to plan, send us an email. The goal is to give the girls the experience they want; don't let the confusion of paperwork stand in the way. As well, Assessors are here to answer questions before the planning.
