

Through experiences and opportunities our Guiders mentored our girls and young women to acquire skills and knowledge necessary to take their place in today's world.

During this past year NL Guiding has witnessed and participated in many changes. Our new Provincial structure has brought us in line with every other Provincial Council in Canada. We are working through the changes adapting to our new way, a learning curve for all involved. We have also witnessed a change in our Provincial Commissioners. I extend my sincere thankyou to both Kay Penney and Pamela Eavis who gave freely and unconditionally to the members of our Province. Through their guidance and leadership NL girls, young women, and Guiders have truly demonstrated that Girl Greatness Starts Here.

We have a lot to be thankful for in this Province and 2016 marked the 100th anniversary of a very significant event in the history of our forefathers. The Battle of Beaumont Hamel was recognized through our Provincial Beaumont Hamel Event. Girls and Guiders participated in events that gave them knowledge and respect for the sacrifices made for today's peace and freedom.

Newfoundland and Labrador Trefoil Guilds hosted the National Trefoil Gathering. When registration opened, the delegates filled every available space and the conference was sold out within a matter of weeks. Never before in its history has this happened and all expectations were surpassed.

Our Cookie Campaigns have continued to be the fuel that makes Guiding grow. From door to door blitzes, Smart Centre sales and creative cookie blitzes our numbers have steadily increased year after year. A big shout out and thankyou

Carissa Haines led the way to ensure every Member in our province had the ability to participate in the Chief Commissioners Rally when Pamela Rice visited in the spring. Through Skype, girls were able to be part of this event without having to travel. Many girls also received Lady Baden Powell, Canada Cord and Chief Commissioners Awards from the Chief during her visit.

Girls were selected to travel Internationally to Creating Impact III in Sangam, India. One very privileged Ranger was chosen to attend the "Pilgrimage to Europe", courtesy of the Royal Canadian Legion. Holly Baker, a young adult, was selected to join the delegation travelling to the Western Region Hemisphere Conference in Curacao led by our National International Commissioner, Sharron Callahan a Newfoundland and Labrador Guider. Risk and Compliance - Officer Kay Graham

In October advisers from across Canada met in Toronto for basic Awards Committee Chair Pamela Eavis training on this newly developed role on Provincial and National Councils. Since then, the Enterprise Risk Management (ERM) Framework, the GGC-wide Risk Register and the Risk Oversight Committee Terms of Reference have all been approved by the Board. The Risk Oversight Committee is comprised of Provincial Risk and Compliance Advisers and a Board appointed chair. The Committee has been working to develop an enterprise-wide risk management implementation plan based on the ERM Framework and the Risk Register. Work on this began in mid-January 2017 with a conference call and has continued through the spring. The Risk Oversight Committee is developing a training package to assist councils in adopting the ERM approach to decision making.

Youth Council - Elected Member Amy Tuck

- This year's Youth Council consisted of an entirely new slate of Members (5 girl and 2 adult)
- Ranger Gathering 2017: Every Girl is a SuperHero Topics being presented include self-confidence; self-esteem; stress identification, management and coping strategies; What is a Feminist? Service projects include bracelet making for women in Africa, collecting toiletry items for women's shelters, and collecting children's books for Ronald MacDonald House

- The Training Committee From May 27 29, 2016, NL Trainers hosted the Eastern Regional Trainer's Conference (ERTC) at Sir Wilfred Grenfell Campus of Memorial University in Corner Brook. A total of 34 participants, including national staff and trainers from across Canada, enjoyed a weekend of professional development and networking. The theme was "Climb Every Mountain". A number face to face Safe Guide and Financial Management training sessions were held, along with other enrichment training sessions. The Committee has worked on a possible action plan for recruitment of new trainers.

Trefoil Guilds - Adviser Patricia Burton

- Our year began with our annual Gathering at Lion Max Simms Camp with 44 Members attending, hosted by Fireside Friends.
- The National Gathering was held at Memorial University with 285 Members from across Canada attending, as well as visitors from the US, UK, and Australia. IN addition to the Host Committee there were 18 delegates from Newfoundland and Labrador. Guild Members from across the province were instrumental in the success of this Gathering, any crazy thing we looked for we got—wool, material, shoes, etc. A great big shout out to the organizing committee who helped to show our true NL culture and hospitality. In one of the Gathering sessions, delegates knitted 287 squares to be made into blankets for cancer patients. There were also 32 pillows made at another session which were donated to the hospital for post-surgery patients.
