# Property Committee News

## **Wa-Thik-Ane Reservations 2017**

The rental procedures for <u>Camp Wa-Thik-Ane</u> have changed to optimize the reservation process with a positive revenue stream for our Provincial Camp! If you haven't already consulted with parents for best weekends to get their commitment, it's a good idea to do it now. Don't wait!

#### The first weekend available for reservation is May 12, 2017

- Reservations for 2017 started on January 9, 2017.
   Only reservations received with a 25% deposit will be considered now and throughout the year.
- All reservation forms must have a 1st, 2nd and 3rd choice indicated.
- Site minimum charges are now in place on certain weekends = 75% of the site capacity charge for nights booked.
- There is a space on the reservation form to offer site sharing. (when you do not have enough people to fit the site capacity)



The reservations will be placed in order of receipt and all Responsible Guiders will be contacted in the following week (Jan 16-Jan 20) to acknowledge receipt of the reservation request and be advised if there is any conflict or contention with the reservation request.

There will be site minimum charges imposed for certain weekends (May 26-28, June 2-4 and June 9-11). (Ex: Huron has a capacity of 40 people. If you are booking for 20 people and if this is what you really want, you will have to pay for 75% of the 40 person capacity - not just for 20 people.)

## **Treasurers' Trove**

Now that we are in a new year, it is time to close up the books for 2016 and have them reviewed. This should not be too time consuming if the books have been kept up to date all year.

Make sure you include all supporting documents with your financial books when you give them to your District Treasurer (Units and Trefoil Guilds) or the Provincial Office (Districts) for review. This is the biggest cause for delays in returning the books, especially as we review the District books.

The deadline for submitting your books for review is January 31. This applies to both Unit and District books.

Remember that you must use independent reviewers (no signing officers, relations or business connections) for the Unit books. Usually this can be done at a book review gathering of all the Unit Treasurers in the District.

Be sure to use the available documents on the GGC Quebec website under Quebec Forms at: <a href="https://www.guidesquebec.ca">www.guidesquebec.ca</a>. There are many guidelines and forms which may answer your questions.

This year, we will have the District Treasurers review each other's books in a similar format as we have in past. We will meet at the same time as the DCs in February, so you can carpool. Those who attend will be able to take their books home with them. Hope to see you all then!

## Red Cross First Aid Courses from Pulse Aide Inc. Tailored to the needs of GGC as per Safe Guide July 2016



Complete details of First Aid Requirements for Safe Guide Activity Levels are found in the Safe Guide document, **July 2016 update**, found on the Girl Guides of Canada national website. Please note that online e-learning courses are not acceptable. Also, in Quebec, blended learning courses (online courses with an in-person hands-on learning component) are not available from the Red Cross as there is no French counterpart to this national program. Pages of interest in Safe Guide 2016 relating to First Aid include, but are not limited to, pg 9-13 & 30-33.

N.B. All Guider First Aid Qualifications must be entered into iMIS <u>before</u> sending your event paperwork to Safe Guide for assessment ( <u>sg.gs@guidesquebec.ca</u> ).

#### **Course Schedules**

Course schedules are created to meet participants' needs, so please contact <a href="mailto:pulseaideinc@gmail.com">pulseaideinc@gmail.com</a> to let us know if you or your District are looking for a First Aid Course sometime this Guiding year. Every effort will be made to try to schedule a course at the location and time that is best for you and/or your District.

#### EFA - Emergency (8 hr) and SFA - Standard (16 hr) First Aid Certification Courses

These courses include the current Red Cross Manual and a Red Cross Certification valid for three years. All courses include Level "C" CPR and AED. These courses are usually given the same weekend, with Emergency First Aid on the Saturday and Standard First Aid both Saturday and Sunday, from 8:30 am to 5:30 pm on both days.

## RECERTIFICATION Course (8 hr) for EFA - Emergency and/or SFA - Standard First Aid \*PRE-REQUISITE:

- \* All Participants must have a CURRENT (not expired) Red Cross Certification at the time of the course
- \* All Participants must bring their own First Aid and CPR manual, 2011 edition, to the course.
- \* All participants must review the content in the manuel BEFORE coming to the course

This course includes recertification of your existing certification (EFA or SFA) for three years.

This course is given on either a Saturday or a Sunday, from 8:30 am to 5:30 pm.
