



August is here and we need to start taking down our canvas tents for winter storage. If you have a day, then this is a sample of what you can help with.




Presenting...The Next Generation Council



Icebreakers: to make sure every girl is seen

Fall brings new faces to our units. How do you welcome new girls? What games do you play? How do you make sure every girl is seen in a new group?

Got an icebreaker to share? Everyone needs to change up their repertoire and this year with the advent of the new Girls First program, it's a great time to shake things up! Share your best icebreaker/welcome games with programme@guidesquebec.ca and we'll add them to this Google Doc.

Sparks/Brownies

Young girls sometimes like to let their actions speak before they are ready to share their thoughts with a group. Try these active games to start building bridges in your units.

SIT DOWN IF...

Have the girls stand in a circle. Ask a range of silly questions and girls sit down if they answered yes to the question. The questions can be as strange or random as you like, for example: "Did you eat cheese today?" The last girl standing is the leader of the next round.

ME, TOO!

The object of this icebreaker is to create a web with a spool of string (or yarn). Have one girl start by holding the string and say something about herself. Sharing one of her favourite things is a great way to start. If that idea applies to another person, she will say "Me too!" The first girl will pass the string to that girl. If more than one girl says

"Me too!" the string is passed in the order it is said. Then the girl now holding the string will share an idea about herself and continue the process until there is a web of connections. Play until everyone is connected to the group.

Guides/Pathfinders/Rangers

Challenge-based icebreakers work well to get girls working cooperatively in a fun way.

FIREFIGHTER RELAY

This is a great for a fun first meeting on a warm early fall night in a local park or field.

Divide your groups into teams of 5. Each team has to transfer as much water as possible from a bucket into another bucket, 5 metres away. The teams have access to tools like scoops, cups, ropes and plastic tubes. They must devise a plan and put it into action. The team who transfers the most water in 10 minutes wins.

ICEBREAKER BALL

You'll need an inflatable beach ball for this game. Use a permanent marker to write random questions all over the ball.

Have the girls lightly throw the beach ball to each other. When they catch the ball, they should answer the question that is closest to their right thumb. After answering the question they will pass it to a new girl.

Nationally Sponsored Trips

Many of our Guiding program activities focus on a global view, and GGC's membership in the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS) makes us all part of a very big sisterhood!

One of our privileges of membership is belonging within this unique network, and as girls reach Pathfinder age, this belonging can take on a whole new dimension: travel in our WAGGGS world!

Each year GGC organizes <u>a number of travel opportunities</u>, and girls can apply to take part. Such trips are sponsored through National and Provincial support to about 2/3 of their cost, and financial help through fundraising is also available.

The application process is looking for girls who are well-rounded, involved and passionate about travel or about Guiding, and can describe themselves and their motivation through their application. Thinking of someone?? Please tell her you thought of her, and perhaps she might think of herself too.

NOTE: the deadline for applications for Guiders and girls is September 12, 2018, so some summer outreach might be in order! And of course there are adult opportunities for each adventure, so maybe this year it's time to think of yourself as well!

Updates to Safe Guide

As usual, Safe Guide was updated in July. You should have received your GuidePost on August 2, which included links to the updated version as well as a document called "Explanation of Changes." Please take a look at this document. The links are here.

Some of the main changes affecting most Guiders are:

- For Green level activities, GGC will no longer be involved in approving arrangements to drive girls as these are considered private arrangements. Vehicle rentals, hay and sleigh rides and floats are still on the chart as Yellow
- Who can pick up a girl has been revised to allow Guiders to use their judgement
- Home trampolines are <u>Not</u> permitted activities
- Trampoline parks are now Conditional Activities, and procedures must be followed, using the TPSP form and obtaining insurance information
- Non-members may be first aiders and must be female for Yellow activities

H.1 Personal Health form - Girl Members

SG.2 Parent/Guardian Permission

SG.3 Activity Notification or Authorization

SG.4 Emergency Response Plan

SG.8 Travel Preauthorization

WA.2 & WA.3 Swim and Boating Test Verification

Submitting forms for Assessment

<u>Please Note</u>: The email for submitting forms (<u>sg.gs@guidesquebec.ca</u>) generates an automatic response. If you do not receive this response, there was a problem with the email you sent. If you do not hear from an assessor within 3 days, please ask <u>sg.gs@guidesquebec.ca</u> and we will follow up. If you send an email to your assessor and do not get a response in a timely manner, please follow up. It is possible they did not receive it, or may need a "nudge". They are busy volunteers, too!

DEAR OLAVE: I'm a Pathfinder Guider and I have a girl who keeps begging me to plan an international trip for our unit. I'd love to take the girls to a World Centre but I just don't have the time to plan something of that magnitude. I could organize a weekend adventure somewhere closer, but I don't think that's what she's got in mind. How can I help her?

DEAR STUCK: Dear Stuck in Canada

Sounds like that girl has big dreams and big goals ahead! Realizing them doesn't need to happen with your unit though. She sounds just like the kind of keen girl who can present herself really well in applying for a Nationally Sponsored Travel opportunity (NST). Her passion for travel will shine through, and her obvious persistence will give her the drive to apply.

Tell her more about the great travel options being promoted for 2019 - here's the <u>link</u>. That kind of passion can earn its own reward, and her dreams could take flight. You don't have to fly to give her wings!

DEAR OLAVE: I'm excited about the new Girls First Program coming this fall but I haven't seen enough about it to know how to start planning my year. I know girls will be more active participants in the planning but I don't want to turn up to my first meeting with nothing! How can I start planning?

Wanting to feel prepared

DEAR WANTING: I'm very glad to hear that you're excited about the new program and embracing our new girl-driven philosophy; we can appreciate you wanting to feel prepared too! There are a few things to keep in mind. This year is a transition year, you

can ease into the new program at your own speed, you will have a variety of resources available that will help you through this transition year; the Girls First Champions, unit card deck, and a variety of online resources and tools. If you want to start straight away, have a look at the Girls First website and contact the Girls First Champions, they will help you navigate through the changes and support you during the transition. If you want to ease in, don't worry about your first few meetings, have fun, meet the girls and ask them how soon they would like to transition; all badges from the current program will be available during this transition period.

The program is changing, but the basics are still the same. You'll still want to do some get-to-know-you activities, find out what your girls are interested in and prepare for enrolment. Once you get in the swing of things I bet it won't feel so foreign.

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DEAR OLAVE: We received information about an opportunity to have a table at a community fair this fall but our district budget is limited and we don't have the funds to pay for supplies for an activity. How can we still attract girls?

DEAR EAGER: It's great that you want to participate in a community fair and that you'd like to plan an activity to attract girls and their families to your table. Lucky for you, we've got a PR subsidy fund just for plans like this. Fill out the Event Subsidy Request form on the <u>provincial website</u> and you could be awarded up to \$75. Read the Kiosk-to-Go document to get some additional ideas about how to make your event as great as possible!
