#### CODING

Girls can code! This is a great skill that girls can embrace and use for many applications in their life. Watch for the release of the new <u>Decode Challenge</u> coming out later this month. In our rapidly changing world, coding helps to promote digital literacy to engage girls in exploring digital media and careers in science and technology. The Decode Challenge replaces the Cybercitizen Challenge. It can be used to promote <u>Safer Internet Day</u> on February 6, 2018.






#### Joke of the month

## Have you nominated a fellow Guider or girl member for an award lately?

Remember any member can nominate another member at any council

#### Here's how to proceed:

- Request an iMIS Profile for the person you are nominating (imis@guidesquebec.ca) (destroyed after use)
- Complete the R.3P Form available at the forms page of Member Zone
- Obtain the necessary letter(s) of recommendation. Attach the letters and the profile to the R.3P form.
- Forward these to your Commissioner or to the Awards Team (<u>awards.reconnaissance@guidingquebec.ca</u>) for approval.
- These can be read at a meeting, by telephone poll or by e-mail vote. Each member of the district or Awards Team vote to approve or not approve the award (must have a majority vote).
- If approved, the signature of the Commissioner is required along with the NAME OF THE COUNCIL.
- Send the R.3P to the Provincial Office for input into iMIS.
- Purchase the award.
- If the presentation date on the form differs from the actual presentation date, it is the responsibility of the Guider who signed the R.3P form to advise the provincial office of the change.
- Upon presentation of the award, the recipient can be given the letters of recommendation.
- For Adult Awards, letters of recommendation must contain the following "buzz" words:

Quebec Award - Distinctive / Medal of Merit - Exceptional
Gold - Outstanding / Silver - Excellent / Bronze - Dedicated / Thanks - Good

If you presented awards to your Guiders in the last Guiding year at your annual district function did you inform the office to update the Guiders' profiles? It's not too late. Please send in the updates to <a href="mailto:imis@guidesquebec.ca">imis@guidesquebec.ca</a>. All awards presented at the Provincial Annual General Meeting (AGM) are updated through the office as they are recorded in the AGM minutes and approved and compiled by the Provincial Awards Specialist.

#### News!

The Canadian Red Cross is in the process of launching their \***NEW**\* First Aid Program which should be completed shortly.

Blended learning courses are coming to Québec to catch up with the rest of Canada (Safe Guide p. 33) - these are online courses with an in-person hands-on learning component! It will mean you complete the theoretical part of the course at home on your own computer in your own time (approximately half of the course time required) prior to the course date, and then come to a hands-on skills portion in-class course (the other half of the course time). Recertifications will still be100% in-class courses.

### **District Book reviews**

A district book review swap is being organized for:

- Monday, February 12, from 6 pm
- Thursday, February 15, from 6 pm
- Saturday, February 17, from 9 am
- Tuesday, February 20 from 6 pm

The reviews will take place at the GGC Québec office.

If you can make any of those dates, please bring your closed December 31,2017 books, ready for review. You will swap books with another reviewer there, and you will be able to bring your books home right away once reviewed.

Please confirm by emailing <u>finances-support</u> whether you will be able to make it on any of the designated dates.

If you can't make it, the books still need to be reviewed. You can either make arrangements with a neighbouring district, or have someone else within the district review the books. Be sure that the guidelines as to independence/no relatives etc. are respected and that the Financial Review Checklist is completed appropriately.

The first page of the Financial Review Checklist (Notes from Recipient Council) is prepared by QC Council and sent to the reviewers. If you won't be there on any of the above dates and are arranging for others to review the books, let me know and I can help fill in that section for your designated reviewer.

If none of those alternatives work, send the books to the office by January 31, 2018 where other arrangements will be made.

### **Book Reviews - Units**

Unit, camp, travel and Trefoil Guild books need to be reviewed by January 31 as well. The reviews are done at the District level, but copies of the Financial Review Checklist and Annual Financial Report must be sent to the office. Deadline to do so is January 31.

#### Book reviews – general guidelines

Many of you are familiar with this process, but as a reminder here is a quick checklist of items to keep in mind for any book review (district, unit or Trefoil Guild):

- 1. On the 'Annual Report' tab make sure your District/Unit/Trefoil Guild name and signing officers are listed at the top. Make sure the proper bank info is at the bottom and fill in the reconciled balance as this is not automatically generated. This page must also be signed by the treasurer and DC. When complete, you need to print this Annual Report.
- 2. Print any 'Main Forms' that you used. Every line should have an "OK."

- 3. Print your explanatory notes if you have them.
- 4. Print your December 31st bank reconciliation.
- 5. Make sure all receipts are with your cheque requisitions, and your deposit slips are clear.
- 6. Make sure you have all bank statements.
- 7. Print any GST/PST related forms.

Be sure to respect the January 31st deadline as noted above.

Be sure to use the available documents on the GGC Québec website under Québec Forms at: <a href="https://www.guidesquebec.ca">www.guidesquebec.ca</a>. There are many guidelines and forms which may answer your questions, such as:

It looks like we will be having an old-fashioned winter this year! We know our girls love to be outdoors in the winter. With that in mind please remember to include Safe Guide in all your plans:
