SAFE GUIDE NEWS - submitted by Carol Skaar

First Aider – Who can be a first aider for a Girl Guide event?

- A female who has attained the Provincial/territorial age of majority and who has a current (not expired) First Aid Certificate (standard or emergency) with CPR-B or C. CPR-A only covers adult.....
- Canadian blended learning courses (online courses with an in-person hands-on learning component) are acceptable. Courses only offered through online e-learning are not acceptable.
- There is a list of health professionals that can be the First Aider; you can find the list on page 11 of the Safe Guide.



Please remember to have your Safe Guide forms into the Provincial Office on time!



- **Yellow Level Activities.....at least 14 days prior to the Activity, page 20 SG**
 - **Red level Activities.....at least 21 days prior to the Activity, page 21 SG**
- Safe Guide forms sent in late will not be assessed; your activity will have to be canceled or planned for another date. So let's not disappoint the girls: do not send in your Safe Guide forms late!

First Aid Training in Saskatoon

There are spots available with the First Aid/CPR/AED class with the Olympic coaches Sunday July 15 at Radius (611 -1st Ave North). Hours will run 9 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. both days. Lunch is not provided.



The cost is \$140 for the full class or if people need to re-certify they would only need to attend on Sunday and the cost is \$90. (For re-cert, the participant will need to show the valid first aid card).

The class is from the Canadian Red Cross and certificates are valid for three years.
