Appreciate and Support Each Other

I am still on my "high" from January Conference! What a superb weekend! Carrie Morrison, Provincial Training Adviser and her training crew did an awesome job! Guiders from across the province, including Guiders from Buffalo Narrows and Green Lake Units, made the trek to Saskatoon! I was able to visit with Guiders that I only see once a year at January Conference, met some new and enthusiastic Guiders, and learned more about the women in our organization that devote their time and talents to the girls in their communities. I even took the opportunity to run a Brownie Session and had great discussions at the PC Q & A Café!

One of the other great experiences over that weekend was launching the new GGC Program called "Mighty Minds". The program was developed to help our girls, Sparks through Rangers, to learn more about mental health awareness. Its aim is to provide them with the tools and the information to live a life of resiliency that is free of stigma around mental illnesses. We took a moment at our Saturday banquet to "Shine a Light on Mental Health". I was honoured to have been able to light a candle that had been lit by Lady Baden-Powell and asked the Provincial Council



members in attendance to light their candles and to pass that light on to all the Guiders in the room. As 140 candles burned, we sang *One Voice*. It was beautiful; it was amazing!

This one moment made me realize that the **Mighty Minds Challenge** is not only for the girls as Guiders struggle as well! We can become



overwhelmed with our responsibilities at work, with our families, and with our volunteer commitments. Guiders are expected to know many different aspects of the organization – Safe Guide, fundraising, how to deal with groups of youth, how to deal with parents, and still run the program on a weekly basis. That can be easy for some and difficult to manage for others.

Guiders have told me that they joined for their girl(s) but stayed for the friendships they made. Many times, it is those friendships that are critical in times of need. Often my role as PC is to help find solutions, particularly for Guiders who feel misunderstood. I have come to realize that *listening* is the strongest asset you can bring to a leadership role. Providing advice, additional information or clarification on the "rules" are secondary once you have listened to the problem or the concern.

I encourage you to not only look out for the girls in your units or in your communities that need our support. Take the time to "check in" with your sister Guiders. Take the time to listen. Sometimes that is all our "sister" needs – just a quiet time to reflect on her feelings. Please be slow to judgement, but do be quick to support. Most importantly, if you need support please reach out. If you do not feel able to reach out to your local Guiders, reach out to your DC, AC and yes, even your PC. I care and I will listen!

Our membership numbers are up for both the girl and adult members this year over last year! It is great to see our numbers increasing again and we were very close to reaching the target goal of 3,500.



Scholarships

Attention all students, girls or adults!

Girl Guides of Saskatchewan have two provincial scholarships available to you!

Mildred Baldwin Scholarship

One scholarship of \$500 will be awarded annually. The Mildred Baldwin Scholarship is a onetime scholarship. Anyone who has been an active Member of Girl Guides for at least five years may apply.

Cynthia O'Connor Scholarship

One scholarship of \$250 will be awarded annually. The Cynthia O'Connor Scholarship is a onetime scholarship. Anyone who has been an active Member of Girl Guides for at least two years may apply.

Applicants can apply for both scholarships but can only receive one in a year. Applicants may only receive each scholarship once in a lifetime.

The deadline for applications, including references and handwritten letter, is <u>September 1</u>. Please send references in sealed envelopes with your applications.

Application forms may be found on the provincial Girl Guide website and are found under forms. The criteria for the applications will be found on the forms.

GGC National Scholarships

There are many national scholarships available. National scholarships are open to both girl and adult members who are pursuing post-secondary education at a recognized college, university or trades program. Scholarships are available for both full-time and part-time studies. Guiders are asked to encourage their girls to apply.



General requirements for all applicants:

- Applicants must be currently registered members.
- Scholarships are conditional on acceptance or continuation in a full-time or part-time program at a recognized post-secondary institution.
- Recognized post-secondary institutions include universities, colleges and vocational schools.
- Scholarship recipients are expected to make reasonable efforts to continue their involvement in Guiding.



The deadline for the GGC national scholarships applications is April 3, 2017 at 11:59 p.m. EST.

The applications must be done <u>online</u>, and received on time! The information can be found on the GGC website by searching Scholarships. Note the current form must be used, and the instructions are given on the website for the process of applying.

Safe Guide

The weather is already starting to warm up and for many of us that means we are starting to make plans for spring and summer camps! A few things to keep in mind as you plan your upcoming activities:

- If you are planning a big trip don't forget that you may need to fill out an SG.8 (Travel Pre-Authorization) and if you will be doing any fundraising it needs to be preapproved with the FR.1 (Application for Fundraising Approval).
- Keep in mind that for most water based activities all participants (girls and leaders) are required to pass a
 Swim Test and/or a Swim Test for Boating. Swim and Boat tests MUST be recorded in iMIS for all girls
 AND leaders.
- Keep your iMIS record up-to-date! If you have received any recent First Aid qualifications (or recertifications), Life Guarding Qualifications, Swim and/or Boat Tests, Activity Facilitator Qualifications (for example, Paddle Canada certifications, NASP certifications, GGC OAL Trainings, etc.) make sure to submit copies of all paperwork to the Provincial Office to be recorded in your iMIS record.

Submitting Safe Guide Paperwork

All Safe Guide paperwork for assessment MUST be submitted to the Provincial Office at provincial@girlguides.sk.ca .

The office ensures the forms are not late, assigns a Safe Guide Assessor and tracks all activities. safeguide@girlguides.sk.ca is for Safe Guide related QUESTIONS ONLY and paperwork submitted to this email address will NOT be assessed and WILL delay your activity approval!

Risk Management

Let me begin by introducing myself and my new role on Provincial Council. In 2016 national provided direction to the provinces that under the new council structure each Provincial Council needed to create a position for a Risk and Compliance Adviser. I was already sitting on Provincial Council as a member at large and was asked to take on this role.

At this time there is still a fair amount of ambiguity as to my role at a national level as processes and committees are put in place in the areas of risk management. At a provincial level, I see my role as identifying areas of risk to our members and the organization as a whole and working towards plans that will help mitigate some of those concerns.

We are all supported by the processes and regulations contained within the Safe Guide which is a great tool for ensuring that we are all accountable. As a Provincial Council we have begun identifying areas of risk specific to Saskatchewan to ensure we are being as diligent as possible. These areas include financial risks and liability to the province, ensuring our insurance is comprehensive and sufficient, and exploring areas of potential risk for our properties and camps.





Canada Flag - painted hand

Ask your town office, rural municipality office, senior's housing or stores if they will display your hand flag art. Be sure to post a sign telling which GGC unit made it. This is good Public Relations.



Need: red washable paint, big rectangular sheet white paper, newspaper, recycled lid, sponge

- Fold paper in half and then in half again lengthwise to make 4 sections.
- Dump some red paint onto middle of recycled plastic lid.
- Put newspaper under the paper to be painted on.
- Put sponge in red paint, dab extra paint off of the sponge.
- Dab red paint from sponge onto two outside sides of the paper.
- Cover the palm of your hand with the sponge with lots of paint on it.
- Spread fingers and press hand on the paper with your longest middle finger on the fold in the middle white section.
- Your hand is the maple leaf on the Canada flag showing you, "I am a Canadian."

Hat swap: Canada flag beaded safety pin camp hat trader




Materials Needed:

14 1 1/16 inches safety pins


1 Two inch safety pin

Seed beads: red and white and plastic lid to put beads in




Instructions:

Each number column represents a pin. Start with row 1. Put 9 red beads on a small pin, close pin and slide onto big open pin through the end ring of small pin. Continue following row number at top of pattern and sliding small pins onto big pin as you fill the small pins. Attach to hat with 14th pin through the end ring of big safety pin.



Or: Pony bead Canada flag camp hat trader. Use red and white pony beads and plastic string.

Friendship Knot: hat swap using craft cord. Pony beads may be tied on the ends.



2017 Girl Guides Clean-Up Saskatchewan Guidelines

Saturday, May 6, 2017

Before the Clean-Up:

- Please refer to the Safe Guide Activity Planning Chart, page 11, and plan accordingly.
- Fill out the Emergency Response Form (SG.4) for each separate location being cleaned.
- Have a plan in place to dispose of the garbage you collect as soon as possible.
- Contact the town, city and/or school to let them know your plan (where you are going to clean and when).
- If you are cleaning a highway, contact Highways & Transportation to let them know your plan.

Things you need:

- First Aiders & First Aid Kit(s)
- Hand Sanitizer (or hand wash jugs & towels)
- Whistle(s)
- Disposable gloves
- Extra work gloves (Suggestion: Younger girls could wear mini-gloves under the disposable gloves.)
- Industrial strength garbage bags
- Coffee cans, plastic jars or milk jugs *WITH LIDS* for sharps and/or pieces of glass
- Safety vests, especially if cleaning highways
- Permission Slips for each participant under 18 (SG.1 and SG.2)
- Emergency contact and medical information for each participant (members & non-members)
- Emergency numbers if applicable and at least one cell phone unless a landline is available nearby
- Emergency Response Plan form (SG.4)

During the Clean-Up:

General:

- Maintain required <u>ratios</u> at all times. (Girls should be in <u>pairs</u>, at least, and should have an adult in sight and within talking distance at all times.)
- Wear gloves at all times.
- Wear sturdy shoes or boots. (Rubber boots would work.) No flip flops or sandals.
- Do NOT wear MP3 players, walkmans, etc... that could distract from danger signs & sounds.
- Clean only during daylight hours.
- Do not clean in <u>severe weather</u> (lightning, heavy rains etc...). In cases of severe weather, please let <u>publicrelations@girlguides.sk.ca</u> know, with your plans to reschedule your event, if possible.
- Do not pick up hazardous materials such as chemical/herbicide containers or animal/birds carcasses. On the highway, contact Highways and let them know what and where the item is to be picked up. In your town/city, find out who to contact to remove these items. Condoms may also be an issue. One suggestion to deal with this issue was to tell younger girls not to pick up any balloons.
- If you find needles, syringes or other sharps, you can use a puncture proof container (coffee can) to collect these. Only ADULTS should ever touch these items. Place the container on a flat level surface, and while wearing gloves, pick up the item by the non-sharp end (i.e., needles by hub, syringes by plunger) and place them in the container. Do not try to put the lid back on the needles. Put the lids in the containers as well. Containers should be taped shut and placed in the garbage for disposal. ***Check with your community in regards to this practice some communities may prefer that needles & syringes are NOT picked up by the general public, and there may be a number to call in this situation.***
- Never squeeze or push down garbage in the bags this could result in injury.
- No pets allowed.
- Have <u>whistle(s)</u> in case of emergency make sure everyone knows what the signals mean and what to do
 if they hear the whistle.
- Assign clear boundaries and make sure everyone stays within them.
- Every participant is encouraged to wear Guiding attire in a bright colour for good visibility.



Highways & Major Roads: (guidelines from Highways & Transportation):

- Cleaners should be over 12.
- Anyone between 8 and 12 can clean highways with low traffic (1500 vehicles/day).
- Wear safety vests.
- Do not pick up tires or tire remnants let Highways know and they will have them disposed of properly.
- Wear lighter coloured clothes that cover arms and legs (old clothes that can get dirty).
- Clean one side of the highway at a time, facing oncoming traffic no zigzagging across the road.
- Do not clean underpasses, bridges or overpasses.
- Stay off the highway.
- Do not direct, stop or interfere with traffic.
- Post signs, if possible, to make the public aware of the fact that you will be cleaning in the ditches.

After the Clean-Up:

- Ensure that all garbage is picked up and delivered to the landfill as soon as possible (ASAP) or designated containers.
- Make sure that someone has contacted any groups like Highways & Transportation to let them know of hazardous materials that needed to be picked up.

<u>PLEASE</u>, before the Clean-Up begins, <u>TALK</u> with all of the participants about the safety guidelines set out above. Discuss emergency plans, point out the first aiders and make sure everyone knows the boundaries.


