## **World Region Challenge Requirements**

#### A. Core Requirements:

**Brownies:** Complete 1 - 3 inclusive **Guides:** Complete 1 - 6 inclusive **Rangers:** Complete 1 - 9 inclusive

- 1. What does WAGGGS stand for and what are the five regions.
- Identify the four World Centres and what Regions they are in.
- 3. What is the CWFF and make a donation to it.
- 4. Understand the World Flag.
- 5. How many countries currently belong to WAGGGS
- 6. What is the significance of Thinking Day?

- 7. What are the official languages of WAGGGS.
- 8. What is the current Twinning Project.
- 9. What is the World Conference and when and where was the last one.
- 10. Find out the role WAGGGS has with the United Nations.
- 11. What are the six components of new WAGGGS Triennial theme?

### B. Selection Requirements

**Note:** From the following list of selected requirements, units do not have to complete the same choice from each Region, e.g. Sparks could do a craft from one Region, a game from another Region, eat something from yet another Region, and so on. Or it could be the same choice from each Region, such as a song.

**Sparks:** Complete one of the following for each of the five World Regions = 5 challenges

**Brownies:** Complete two for each of the five World Regions = 10 challenges **Guides, Pathfinders & Rangers:** Complete three for each of the five World Regions = 15 challenges

#### **Selections:**

- 1. Make a craft from a country, other than your own, in a WAGGGS Region.
- 2. Play a game or sport from a country, other than your own, in a WAGGGS Region.
- 3. Sing a song from another country.
- 4. Try a food from another country.
- 5. What is the Promise, Law, and Motto of a branch of Guiding in your age group from another country.
- 6. Lean how to say two useful phrases in another language.
- 7. Learn about the uniform of a branch of Guiding in your age group from another country.
- 8. Invite a member of guiding who has traveled to another country within Guiding, to visit your unit.
- 9. Learn about a religion different from your own.
- 10. Discuss customs of a country and what a traveler can do to show respect.
- 11. Find out the exchange rate of one Canadian dollar to another currency.
- 12. Learn how Thinking Day is celebrated in another country.
- 13. Learn about a festival in another country.
- 14. Learn about women's issues in another country and how guiding is involved.
- 15. Communicate by mail or the internet with a Guiding unit in another country.
- 16. Find out about traditional children's toys in another country.
- 17. Identify an environmental issue that Guiding is or could be involved in.
- 18. Find out how children's birthdays are celebrated in another country.
- 19. Learn about traditional women's dress in another country.
- 20. Learn about the role of girls in another country...what age can they date, marry, complete their schooling.
- 21. Do a skit that shows how a typical Guiding Unit in your age group would be run in another country.
- 22. Write a song (any style) that would describe a World Region of WAGGGS. Example: Create a rap or a folk song from the names of the countries in a World Region, and utilize the names of the different branches of Guiding in those countries.
- 23. Find out what kind of outdoor activities girls in your age group do in Guiding in another country.
- 24. Describe a service project that is being undertaken by girls in another World Region and compare it to the service projects that your unit has done.
- 25. Attend an International Camp with Guides from at least one other Region in Guiding.
