

JOYCE FOSTER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Joyce Foster was an avid girl member and guider who lived in Red Deer, Alberta. She participated in activities like camping and sports, and enjoyed travelling the world. She was a teacher in Alberta, Australia, and New Zealand over the course of her career. She came back to Canada and settled down in Calgary where she was involved with many social clubs. Joyce enjoyed volunteering and was selected to attend a large national camp in Ottawa in 1952. She continued to travel in her later life and was an active Guide leader for many years.

Who is eligible for this scholarship?

Any member of Girl Guides of Canada, Alberta Council who has not previously received this scholarship and will be attending an accredited Canadian post-secondary institution full-time for the fall term. The applicant must be studying Education or a field related to Sustainability.

What is the purpose of this scholarship?

To assist with the cost of full time post-secondary education in memory of Joyce Foster.

Criteria:

- Applicant is a well-rounded active member of Girl Guides of Canada in Alberta, Northwest Territories, or Yukon.
- Applicant is an active member and displays leadership in their wider community, Guiding or otherwise.
- Scholarship is conditional on acceptance at the institution of recipient's choice as a fulltime student enrolled in the fall semester of the coming academic year.
- Recipient is to continue her membership in Guiding.
- Scholarship may only be received once.
- Reference letters must be dated within six months of the application deadline.
 References from family members will not be accepted. References must be from nonacademic sources and demonstrate community involvement both outside of and within Guiding.
- Applicant is pursuing a program in Education or in a field related to sustainability, including (but not limited to): Conservation, Environmental Science, and Ecology.
- A copy of the applicant's most recent official academic transcript must be included with the application.

Candidates will be evaluated in terms of the following:

- Guiding Experiences (10 points)
- Academic and Extracurricular Achievements (5 points)
- Community work (5 points)
- Leadership activities (5 points)
- Hobbies/Personal Interests (3 points)
- Instances of Leadership (3 points each)
- Response to statements on Guiding (5-10 points each)

Scholarships of \$1,000 each will be funded by Alberta Council from the Joyce Foster internally restricted endowment fund created in 2018, until funds are depleted.

Deadline for receipt of applications:

• Application must be received at the Alberta Council Office by the second Friday in May.

• Original copies must be received typed to the Alberta Council Office.
