The Eco-Pak was developed in 2006 and is contained in a special backpack. The goal of this tool is to provide resources for girls and Guides to naturally integrate environmental considerations into their thinking and actions. The Eco-Pak provides sample games, activities, experiments, ideas for Guiding challenges and a list of resources so that you can start incorporating environmental stewardship as part of the whole Guiding program. In 2014 the Eco-Pak Challenge was updated to include all activity instructions. Thus you no longer need an Eco-Pak to complete the challenge.
