# How Girl Guides is unlocking the power of girls

In today's world, Girl Guides is one of those rare places that makes space for girls' voices. In Guiding, girls can find a safe space to talk about tough topics and explore new interests with the support of other girls and Guiders who are committed to helping them turn their ideas into actions.

At GGC, providing girls with a platform to speak up on what's important to them is at the heart of what we do. That's why our girl-driven approach puts girls front and centre — giving girls a starring role in shaping their Guiding experience. # 2019 highlights



Girls told us about the importance of leadership opportunities in Guiding — and we listened! We launched new resources to support the Girl Assistant role — girls volunteering in units with younger girls — and saw an increase in the number of Girl Assistants.



Our Voices to Votes programming allowed girls of all ages to learn about the federal election and voting process, meet inspiring women in politics, and speak up on what matters to them for the future of our country.



We increased the number of committees with girls on them by 41%.



We passed the mic to girls and young women with Wave Makers, our team of youth spokespersons, with a focus on relevant and timely issues that impact girls in Canada today.



The National Youth Council championed issues such as keeping teens engaged in Guiding, Indigenous issues and engagement, and international connections — ensuring girls' voices and perspectives are brought forward to the Board of Directors.



Every girl's voice matters — and every girl should be valued for exactly who she is. Our Indigenous Girl Guides gathering allowed participants to share how Guiding can better support girls in their communities.



The Ranger Task Force amplified the voices of teenage girls in Guiding — offering input on programming, special experiences and the kinds of skills girls want to step into leadership roles.



Girls' input played a key role in the design of our simplified and more inclusive uniform — a short-sleeve T-shirt or tunic.

Approximately 600 teams and over 3,000 women participated in our first-ever Sisterhood Challenge – with activities focused on celebrating the friendship and support that connects women in Guiding.



Young women in Guiding had the opportunity to explore leadership opportunities on the global stage, including participating in the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts Western Hemisphere Conference.
