## **Protect that brain – helmets for winter activities**



If you're planning a winter adventure for your unit, don't forget to include helmets in your downhill skiing, skating, snowboarding, sledding or snow tubing kit list. Helmets are an essential safety item that can help protect in the case of a fall or crash. Helmets must meet the National Standard for the activity (see Parachute Canada's <u>Which Helmet For Which Activity?</u> for details). Remember that regular bike helmets won't cut it for winter sports – they're not built for the cold or the kind of impacts you might encounter.
