TRANSITIONING MEMBERS- Nova Scotia Registration Process

Transitioning Members (TMBR's) are members who are 18 years of age in the province of NS and who wish to participate in youth programs.

- They cannot register as a Ranger if they are 18 years old as of Sept 1st of the Guiding year and must register as a TMBR in NS.
- They cannot register in an Extra-ops group as they are 18 years of age.
- If they are 17 as of Sept 1st they may stay in the Ranger Program.

MOTION: June 13, 2013 – NS Council will pay the membership for any girl in her transitioning year.

Transitioning Members (Members18 years of age):

- A TMBR can be registered as a Girl Assistant in a Spark, Brownie, Guide or Pathfinder unit but not a Ranger unit.
- TMBR's not working in a unit should be registered as a "Girl Member at Large" at the Provincial level in the TMBR unit.
- A TMBR cannot be registered as a Link Member as this is an adult activity.
- Does not need a PRC while she is a TMBR.
- Can be used in a supervisory role for green level activities- please refer to Safe Guide section Supervision. She cannot be the First Aider for any events /camps.
- Cannot be used in a supervisory role for yellow or red level activities and must be counted as a girl
 member for these activities. Please refer to Safe Guide section Supervision.
- Needs parent permission for yellow and red activities.
- Once a TMBR reaches the age of Majority (19) a TMBR begins the screening process to become an adult member.

NEW & Returning Members

Transitioning Members (who are 18 at time of Registration)

• Completes an A5 and submits form to the Provincial office.

Provincial Office Process

Customer Service Rep (CSR)

- Receives form, if payment received, returns payment to parents with standard letter.
- Date stamps form and forwards to IMIS Coordinator

IMIS Coordinator

• Enters A5 into iMIS and files form.

• Contacts TMBR for Unit placements options &advises IMIS>
