

These are just a few of the comments that we received from participants. The <u>pictures</u> tell an even better story!

The registration for this year's symposium was 160 participants out of 400 adults or 40% of adult members in the province - a very strong registration indeed. In spite of the wintery weather, we had a very high number of participants on the day of the symposium. It may have been cold and snowy on the outside but it was warm with the sisterhood of Guiding on the inside.

The workshops in the morning offered 10 topics of choice and the afternoon workshops were focused on the **Girl-Guider partnership** – or as some Guiders put it –

- ⇒ "It's about being a leader and not the boss"
- ⇒ "Interpretation of leadership from a girl point of view and what it means to her"
- ⇒ "Partnership can happen even at the Spark level"
- ⇒ Need to "try and understand how the girls see the leaders"
- ⇒ "Important to have group involvement"




This time of year is celebrated in countries the world over – it is Carnaval time! Since it is also our Thinking Day season, this note from a Guider in Greece was timely:

Camping Corner

This time we would like to give you some fun recipes to try at your next camp - some healthy and one that is a Pathfinder favorite snack!

EASY SKILLET PASTA

Camp stove 1 kg hamburger
Big pot 2 tsp dry basil
Spoon 4 cups water

Propane 2 large cans diced tomatoes
Can opener 1 pkg dry onion soup mix

4 cups bow tie pasta 2 cups grated mozzarella

Brown hamburger, drain any fat. Add tomatoes, water, basil and onion soup.

Bring to a boil and add pasta. Stir, return to a boil and simmer for 20 minutes, stirring often to prevent scorching. Sprinkle cheese over each serving.

POT OF GOLD

Camp stove 4 cans tomato soup Big pot 1 Pillsbury biscuits

Cutting board 4 tomato soup cans of water

Ladle 250 gr cheese

Propane Knife spoon

Cut cheese into small cubes. Place soup and water in pot and bring to a boil. Cut biscuits into 4 pieces and wrap each piece around a cube of cheese. Drop into boiling soup and simmer, uncovered for about 10 minutes, or until dough is cooked. Stir often to prevent soup from burning.

TRASH

Camp stove 1/4 lb butter

Medium pot 1 cup peanut butter Spoon 1 box Crispix cereal

Propane 1-283 gr bag chocolate chips

Big bowl 250 gr icing sugar

Grocery bag

Melt the butter, chocolate chips and peanut butter over low heat. Pour the Crispix into large bowl. Pour the melted mixture over and gently fold ingredients together until cereal is coated. Place in grocery bag and add the icing sugar. Shake to mix.

NOTE: DOUBLE THIS RECIPE - IT WILL GO FAST!

1st St-Lazare Guides

QUEBEC SPIN #1: Science Badge Event / Guinness Book of World Records

Take the Lead / Guiders / Share It / Sisterhood (a Bring-A-Friend event)

For our Bring-a-friend meeting, we decided to do science round-robins as we were working on our Science badge at the time. We planned our meeting to coincide with the National Science and Technology Week (NSTW). To this end, we hosted our own NSTW event. On the government's science website there is a lot of info and news on Canada's efforts to set a new record in the Guinness Book of World Records for giving the World's Largest Science Lesson. We started the evening by showing the girls the promotional video clip for the experiment.

This meeting also provided the perfect opportunity to introduce Astronaut Chris Hadfield to the girls (which we were excited about as we had planned another project based on his upcoming space mission). We showed the girls a video clip of Chris talking about the Guinness World Record for the World's Largest Science Lesson.

Although the actual Guinness event was happening in the afternoon at multiple locations across Canada, and we were meeting in the evening, we thought it would be meaningful to run the meeting on the same day and in the same manner that the official lessons were taking place, so that our girls could look back and feel like they were a part of something greater that was actually a history-making event!

QUEBEC SPIN #2: Aeronautic and Science Badges / Chris Hadfield Mission

Explore / Unit / Blog it / Learning

Given that 2012 was a big year for the Canadian space program, with the 50th Anniversary of the Alouette I and Chris Hadfield's historic space mission, we decided to focus on the girls' Aeronautics and Science badges in Beyond You, the program area we are working on this year.

We listened to an interview with Chris Hadfield. The parents were encouraged to watch Apollo 13 with their daughters (skip the first 1/2 hour of exposition) and we did a fun communication game based on a scene in the film -- "Houston, we've got a problem" - the scene where the astronauts were running out of oxygen and Ground Control had to put together a device to fix the problem (using only things that they would have on board the space craft). The trickiest part was really how would they communicate their solution -- effectively, and without seeing each other. We took the opportunity to speak to the girls about the importance of clear communication and careful listening in all our relationships.

The game: We had four parents each send in two identical sets of lego (each a 20 piece set, a mirror image of the other). We then had each of our four 3rd year Patrol leaders become the Commander and sit back to back with the 2nd year girls in their patrols, their crew. Our 1st years (Ground Crew) were handed one of the two matching sets of Lego with which to build the "replacement space ship part" -- the 2nd years were handed the mirror set. The 1st years handed their completed "part" to the Commanders who had to accurately communicate how to replicate the part to their 2nd year crews.

We also paid a visit to the Cosmodome in Laval. They created a five hour program for us that covered the Aeronautics badge and much of our Science badge.

We contacted the CSA (Canadian Space Agency) and asked if they had any special CSA adhesive patches. They were delighted to send us as many as we needed, and they also sent CSA bookmarks and rulers. Best of all, we received a package of 25 beautiful sew-on CSA crests! Along with mini Canadian flags and painter's paper coveralls, we created our own spacesuits!

Dressed in our new spacesuits, we took photos of the girls pretending to be in a photo with Chris Hadfield for his online photo competition. We timed the release of the photo with Chris Hadfield's blast off -- so the girls would be reinvigorated by the mission -- he departed on December 19 and all our girls excitedly watched him take off.

REMINDERS:

- It's time to check your First Aid certification before spring and summer camping! Don't wait until you are sending in your camping plans to the Safe Guide Assessor Team before first checking on your First Aid certification expiry date! There is NO leeway you are either certified, or you are not. It doesn't matter if your certification expired only "yesterday", or if you have already cashed the cheques from the parents, or if you have already paid a non-refundable deposit on your campsite. You cannot be the First Aider for camp unless your certification is current and will not expire before the end of the camp. So NOW is the time to find that card and check your dates! The second thing to check is that your qualifications are duly entered into iMIS before you present your camp plans for evaluation by a Safe Guide Assessor.
- ♦ All Pulse Aide Inc. courses include the Canadian Red Cross First Aid and CPR/AED Revised Program Standards for 2013, and the new Red Cross Manual. Certification is valid for three years from the date of the certification.
- Upon completion of a recognized First Aid training, GGC-Québec Council will reimburse 2/3 of the cost for an adult Guider.



Safe Guide News

Safe Guide, our risk management program, must be completed within six months of becoming a registered Guider. Based on our Safe Guide Compliance Report, we have 23 Guiders for whom Safe Guide training is due in March 2013 and 14 Guiders due in April 2013. Please contact your DC.

2013 Financial Package

The 2013 Financial Package is now available on the GGC QC website here.

For those of you who have already started this year's books with the old 2012 template, there's no need to panic. Other than the dates, there are no changes between last year's and this year's form. Please take the time to update the year on your spreadsheet, or things will get messy! Here's how to do it:

- 1. On the Annual Financial Report, cells 7D and 8D: you need to click in each cell, then change the year on the line at the top where it says fx: 1/1/2012. Simply click on the 2012 and change it to 2013. You need to do this twice, in 7D and 8D.
- 2. While you are on the Annual Financial Report, don't forget to fill in your Unit name at the top, writing over the GGC Unit / Council, and your signing officers. Add an 'S' or 'F' if they are only there for half the year. You can add a new person in the fall if necessary. Also fill in your bank information further down, then you won't have to do it later, and again, the information is used on other forms (i.e. the Deposit slip) automatically.
- 3. Then on the Main Form, in cell 9A, click and change the year there too. If you have issues, let me know and I'll help.


