



Awards Update

Have you nominated a fellow Guider or girl member for an award lately?

Here's how to proceed:

- Request an iMIS Profile for the person you are nominating (imis@guidesquebec.ca)
- Complete the R.3P Form available at the forms page of MemberZone (PDF copy HERE)
- Obtain the necessary letter(s) of recommendation. Attach the letters and the profile to the R.3 form.
- Forward these to your Commissioner or to the Awards Team (awards.reconnaissance@guidingquebec.ca) for approval.
- These can be read at a meeting, by telephone poll or by e-mail vote. Each member of the district or Awards Team votes to approve or not approve the award (must have a majority vote).
- If approved, the signature of the Commissioner is required along with the NAME OF THE COUNCIL.
- Send the R.3P to the Provincial Office for input into iMIS.
- Purchase the award.
- If the presentation date on the form differs from the actual presentation date, it is the responsibility of the Guider who signed the R.3P form to advise the provincial office of the change.
- Upon presentation of the award, the recipient can be given the letters of recommendation.
- The iMIS Profile must be destroyed.
- For Adult Awards, letters of recommendation must contain the following "buzz" words:

Quebec Award – Distinctive / Medal of Merit – Exceptional Gold –Outstanding / Silver –Excellent / Bronze –Dedicated / Thanks –Good

For additional awards, consult Unit Support Resources in MemberZone.



If you presented awards to your Guiders in the last Guiding year at your annual district function did you inform the office to update the Guiders profile? *It's not too late.* Please send in the updates.

For awards that *do not* require Provincial approval, we ask that the DC please send the information to imis@guidesquebec.ca. Here is an updated schedule for Red Cross Emergency and Standard First Aid Courses being offered to Guiders for the balance of this Guiding year. Non-members are also welcome, but their prices are \$125 for Emergency and \$140 for Standard First Aid.

The following Emergency and Standard First Aid Courses include the current Red Cross Manual and a Certification valid for 3 years.

Upon completion, GGC - Quebec Council will reimburse 2/3 of the cost for active Guiders.

The following one-day **Recertification Course** is only for those who hold a CURRENT (unexpired) Red Cross Certification. Participants must re-read their manual and brush up on the theory BEFORE attending the course! Certification is for another 3 years. The Red Cross Manual you received in 2012 is mandatory - a new one must be purchased well in advance of the course date (so you can study!) if you cannot find yours.

Treasurers' Trove

For Unit and District Treasurers

Several small notes this month:

- Many thanks to the District Treasurers who turned out to help review each others' books during DC Day.
- For those of the District Treasurers who did not attend, note that the District Financial Books should have been sent to the office by now!
- The unit and Trefoil Guild books should have been reviewed and the Annual Financial Reports and Financial Review Checklists should have been sent to the office.
- For books which have been reviewed (i.e. dnit books), we don't need copies of spreadsheets sent to the office, just the AFR and FRCs. But remember that you must keep <u>all</u> documentation (including receipts or copies of the receipts if the originals were sent in for taxation purposes as well as copies of the

- spreadsheets etc.) for 7 years!
- Don't forget your Canadian World Friendship Fund money! Your district should send a cheque to the Provincial office. It should be for at least all money you have collected if you had a special event, or minimum \$1.00 per member.
- Cookies will soon be here! Remember there is a blackout on other fundraising for one month after the cookies arrive. This allows our girls to concentrate on the best fundraiser available to us!
