1970

- 1970, Provincial Guiders' Conferences began for practical program training
- Provincial Commissioner Mrs.C.C. Stewart, opened the Provincial Guide Store
- A mammoth birthday party was held across Canada, the same year we held an International Young Adults Conference
- 1977, Link Units opened. Young members of the Trefoil, tired of being confused with their elder counterparts in the Trefoil Guild, received National Council approval for the name change to Link. These were women who could not remain active in units, but wished to remain linked to Guiding
- February 15, 1978, after a province wide fundraising effort, Provincial Guiding moved into its new building, on 8th Avenue. The opening was conducted by Provincial Commissioner Mrs. R.H.Rogers., who was assisted by a Brownie
- Fall of 1979, first Pathfinder Units opened. The name was first mentioned in Lord BP's, *Scouting for Boys*, when he referred to the special Indian guides who were good at finding their way in a strange land
