When We Shine is the theme of our 2017 Annual General Meeting and annual report. When We Shine recognizes that at any level, as an individual or as a small group at the unit, district, area or provincial level, we can do amazing things. Individually, members can be the spark that ignites an interest, provides an opportunity for growth or is the smile that welcomes a girl into a new circle of friends. As a group, we can be the ignition source to make a difference in our communities and to people around us, near and far. As Girl Guides we can effect change by bringing awareness through our actions to the communities we live in. When We Shine, we are powerful!

A shining moment for BC Girl Guides this year was the establishment of the BC Youth Forum. These members provide the youth voice and insight to BC Council initiatives. Their first impact was taking the lead and delivering on the BC launch of Mighty Minds.

In 2017 we happily welcomed 378 new members to experience Guiding in BC. Our 2.18 per cent increase in membership compares favourably with the 1.5 per cent increase in national membership and continues along the path of slow but steady growth in the province.

Here are some other shining examples of what members did in 2017!

We Shine through Experiences, Events and Adventures

★ Rivers North Area hosted SOAR 2017, and everyone involved, from steering committee

and core staff to participants, showed the communities of Smithers, Houston and the Hazeltons what it was like to be Girl Guides. And all attending became honourary Smithereens.

- ★ We met new friends at large events like Rally in the Valley, Hands Across the Border and Mix it Up Girl Guide and Girl Scout encampment.
- ★ New experiences like snow camping, snowshoeing, hiking, night treks and zombie nights provided opportunities to learn new skills and push beyond normal boundaries. And perhaps it sparked a new interest in adventure!
- ★ At BC Girl Guide nights with the Vancouver Canucks and the Vancouver Whitecaps, we showed everyone we are here and How We Shine when together.

We Shine through Global Awareness

- ★ Our members showed that by their actions they can help to make a better world through attending events and activities that raise awareness of global issues that affect our world, such as attending the Me to We Take Action Academy, participating in local pride festivals and attending Mighty Minds events throughout BC
- ★ BC members travelled to Ireland, Europe, Mexico, Ecuador and across Canada and came home to share their experiences. These types of trips are amazing as girls find lifelong friends and share what it is like to be a Canadian and a Girl Guide. Through service they help to support and enhance a local community.
- ★ Units and councils fundraised for Canadian World Friendship Fund to support our sisters in other countries. World Thinking Day activities and Cupcakes and Candles shone the light on our worldwide organization.
- We supported awareness of a need for action closer to home by participating in local Hikes for Hunger and Food for Friends drives. We prepared and served meals at soup kitchens and outreach centres. We made our local communities a bit brighter by adopting parks and roads, planting bulbs and volunteering at community and shoreline cleanups. We welcomed new friends at refugee welcoming events and visited local seniors to play games and sing songs. By these actions we show that we care about the people and the places in our community.

We Shine through Education

- ★ We provide a spark that helps our members explore new things or known things in a new way through our programming. Guides and Rangers got to investigate university life at GUEST and Ranger Rendevous. Through STEM activities as well as through art and drama we got to experience many different things presented in many different ways. New challenges developed by our provincial committees continued to be very popular right across Canada.
- ★ Adult members got the chance to take leadership to a different level by challenging themselves at the Outdoor Activity Leadership Module 8 Snowshoeing training. The skills they developed and the members' confidence will assist girls in adventuring!

We Shine through Training

- ★ By participating in training, our adult members get the opportunity to explore new interests, learn or enhance their skills and share the spark of learning so all can shine. In 2017, there were workshops held to assist advisers at the area and provincial level to inspire other members and to do the vital work that keeps BC Guiding strong. BC Camping developed and delivered a webinar on working with special dietary needs at camp; it was very successful with lots of participation from across the province.
- ★ Strong mentors continue to support leader development with new Guiders; this vital role helps to ensure all members feel supported and valued. Two areas developed their own shining moments—one by developing a diversity and inclusivity team to help identify barriers to welcoming more girls to experience Guiding, and the other by developing a team to help Guiders support every girl to be successful in Guiding. These local initiatives were the spark of initiative and show the strength and commitment of our members to ensure everyone has the chance to experience Guiding and be successful in it.

This is a small sampling of experiences and opportunities that were offered to our members this past year. There are many more examples of how our members shine in what we do and how we do it: with laughter and fun, excitement to learn and compassion for others, making the world around us a bit brighter for all. None of this could happen without the dedication of our volunteers and the members who participate. Each brings their own unique spark that ignites the flame of Guiding, and together we all shine! 
