### **Spotlight on PR**

Thanks to everyone who took the time to stop by the PR table during the Boardwalk at the Symposium. We loved chatting with you and demystifying PR a little! Remember PR isn't scary – we're all walking, talking PR for Girl Guides. Now, we want to let you in on a little secret: that table you visited during Boardwalk was a live version of a PR booth you can create yourselves within your communities! Remember those cute SWAPs\* that you all loved?! That was the magnet we used to pull you in, to ensure you stopped by so that we could chat. Sneaky huh? Not really, just good PR!

This month's spotlight features booth basics. You've locked down a date and event within your community (could even be meet the teacher night at your local school) – now what? Time to plan for your booth, table or space.

#### **Booth Basics**

**Be visible, Decorate** – Use streamers and balloons in Guiding colours (balloons are available at the provincial office) to attract people to your booth. Or, if the event you are attending has a theme, decorate for that. Set up your district's feather flag.

**Draw them in, Activity** – Have something on hand that will entice people to stop. A super simple craft (a SWAP\* works well for this), an activity sheet, an easy game or girls singing are all great ideas. If it's an event where there are children – even better. Keep them busy (brothers too!) while you chat with parents.

**Talk it up** – Once you have their attention, talk it up. Don't worry too much about what to say. There's no perfect speech. Let them know what Girl Guides is all about and share your passion for what you do.

Show what Guiding is about, Display – Have pamphlets, bookmarks, magnets etc. on the table readily available for visitors to take or for you to grab and hand to them. It's best if they take something home, that way they can reference the website or give us a call. A camp blanket or badge sash makes a great conversation starter too.

Etiquette – SMILE, greet everyone with a "Bonjour/Hi", be polite and enthusiastic and don't sit. Standing at your booth makes you much more approachable, and feel free to roam out from behind the table too. Being approachable also means not sitting looking at your phone and not chatting too much with the person you are working with at the booth.

Good luck! We're always looking to hear from you about anything that's worked for you so that we can share. For more great tools and in-depth ideas visit this <u>link</u>.

\*SWAPS: Girl Guides or Scouts often make small tokens of friendship to exchange with the Girl Guides/Scouts they meet while traveling. These little gifts are called "SWAPS," which stands for "Special Whatchamacallits Affectionately Pinned Somewhere."

#### Girls LOVE new ideas!

#### Adapted from an article in TEAMTALK Fall 1993

**Our girls love it when we let them try new ideas**, put new twists on old activities or take a chance to try something off the wall. Many guiders envy those they consider "idea-people" and willingly let them take the lead when it comes to planning programs or events. But, all of us can learn to be more creative. All it takes is practice.

Some might say life is like eating grapefruit, first you break through the skin, take a few bites to get used to the taste, then just as you begin to enjoy it, it squirts you in the eye. Some might say that letting the girls try new ideas is the same. A good response in girl-led programming is to wipe your eye and take another bite.

When we are trying to be creative, we need to fight idea-enemies or killer phrases. Sometimes we provide them ourselves with self-doubts but most often they are donated by someone else. Before you sit down to think about planning, allow the group to share its favorites idea stoppers. *(it's not in the budget, we tried that before, it'll never work, we don't have time)* It takes a creative touch to handle these in a positive way. With everyone being aware of the activity, work to remove them from your group-think. **Expose them**; throw a nerf ball at the user, issue a 25¢ penalty, wear a green hat for the brainstorming times and a black hat for playing the devil's advocate, announce a comeback of the month contest. The key is to recognize them as comments which derail creativity.

Once you have exposed idea stoppers, warm up your brains. First, let people know in advance what you will be discussing, this allows everyone to come prepared. Next, stretch with an ice breaker. Then, move into your brainstorming or idea generating stage. There are no bad ideas, something which seems impossible can open the idea to something possible which had not been considered before. The filtering and selecting comes later, when realistic opportunities and barriers can be applied not just hypothetical ones.

To be truly creative we need many points of view. If we have only one idea, we have nothing with which to compare it. We are moving into a period of change in our organization, let's all try to stretch our imaginations to the fullest. Be impractical. Look for the second right answer and the third and fourth. Set your creative self free and have fun with your Guiding doing activities the girls love!

For a YELLOW ACTIVITY send SG.1, SG.2, SG.3, SG.4 and SG.5/7 if applicable to sg.gs@guidesquebec.ca at least 14 days in advance to be assessed. Don't forget to be using the current forms.

Make sure first aid qualifications, PRCs and A.7s are recorded in iMIS. If someone has completed their first aid course recently, make sure it gets sent to <u>iMIS</u>.

Remember that new Guiders have 6 months in which to complete Safe Guide training or they will be cancelled by National. Your District Commissioner can help you with the on-line version of this training. <u>Girls</u> love all the outdoor activities we do in Guiding. <u>Guiders</u> love it when the girls have a safe and fun time!
