





You've likely heard by now that GGC has a new logo, many versions of a new logo in fact. If you're looking to use it, there are a few things you should know first:

- The logos, letterhead, sash and brand standards and merchandise

  Guidelines are available at <u>girlguides.ca/brand</u> if you log in with your Member

  Zone credentials.
- All merchandise you make must have the trefoil and event name on it (crests, clothes, etc), and, whether you are selling it or not, it needs to be approved by <u>Lizzie</u> at the office. It can be produced <u>ONLY</u> for events.
- ✓ Anything with the old logo is still good to use (feather flags, uniforms, etc.)
- ✓ We will be using up current PR material before moving over to the new material. Please don't throw it out!
- These are just a few examples of the new logo. There are many more combinations.

### **Reviews**

Thanks to all District Treasurers who have sent in their reviewed books or participated in the book swap earlier in February. Your help in getting the books reviewed is greatly appreciated!

For those of the District Treasurers who have not done so, note that the books should have been sent to the office by now for review. If your books were reviewed by another party, please forward the signed Annual Financial Report (AFR) and the signed Financial Review Checklist (FRC).

The Unit and Trefoil Guild books should have been reviewed and the AFRs and FRCs should have been sent to the office. Keep in mind that the office does not need copies of the spreadsheets, just the AFRs and the FRCs. However, you must keep <u>all</u> documentation (including receipts or copies of the receipts if the originals were sent in for taxation purposes as well as copies of the spreadsheets etc.) for 7 years in order to comply with the document retention policy.

#### Other

CWFF money is due soon as well. A cheque should be sent to the office that is at least equivalent to all money collected. Keep in mind that the suggested minimum is \$1 per member.

### **Cookies**

The classic cookies will also be delivered shortly! Remember there is a blackout on other fundraising for one month after the cookies arrive. This allows our girls to concentrate on the best fundraiser available to us. There are also many resources available in the cookie section of the provincial website to assist with cookie tracking and inventories.

As a reminder, cookies given away or used in the unit/district are more complicated because you have bought these cookies, but have no proceeds for them. In order to balance overall, a cost must be associated with them and recorded in the spreadsheet:

- When 1 box of cookies is eaten at camp, these should be recorded in the Camp column in the expense section.
- Since the cases are currently bought for \$48.45, each box used or given away costs \$4.04 (\$48.45/12 boxes)

If a box is given as a "thank you" for a guest, or a gift it should be in the appropriate column.

When paying the supporting council for the cases you bought (see earlier paragraph) you would split out the total between cookies sold and cookies used:

Signing officers need to be changed or approved (if no change) at the start of every Guiding year <u>and should be done by now</u>. This must be done through an approved motion at a District meeting. Any changes should be brought to the bank's attention to update the signatures in a timely manner.

The PC, RoseAnna Cirino, is to be the only Provincial designate on all <u>District</u> level accounts.

In the past, anytime you have held a yellow or red level event, your Safe Guide assessor gave you an emergency contact number to add to your SG.4. This is changing. From now on, the emergency number will always be 438-622-8485. You won't have to wait for your assessor to let you know, you can already indicate it on your SG.4 when you send it for assessment.


